

Dear Friends in Christ:

Wow! It has been a fast – and busy – first month ministering with you. We've had joys (the baptism of Hollyn Wegman) and sorrows (the passing of Pastor Harold Harmison). We've applied the ashes of mourning during the start of Lent, and celebrated the power of Christ and his victory in confirmation class and

the Lord's Supper. And we've only begun!

I've greatly enjoyed getting to know you, and I am starting to remember names apart from the Sunday morning name tags, though I still appreciate your wearing them and allowing me to cheat a bit, at least for a little while longer. I have found the people of First to be faithful, caring believers who are eager to offer encouragement and kindness. Thank you.


More people than I can count have asked if there's anything they can do for me, and in case you have the same question, I am going to say that, yes, I do need something – your prayers. Although all of us know that prayer is of primary importance, it's one of those things that we can allow to become an afterthought. When crisis hits, prayer is our natural response, but in day-to-day activity, we often overlook prayer. We can rush right through something, never once pausing to ask for God's blessing or the knowledge of God's will. This can be especially true in ministry. You'd think that our programs, plans, and ideas would be the first thing we'd lift up to the throne of God to make sure that we're on the right track. Granted, sometimes we do but certainly not often enough. I don't say this as a criticism of First Church – this is an issue that vexes the entire Body of Christ. Every believer is affected.

I ask that you pray that God will give me insight into how he wants me to lead. Pray for God's protection, that I would remain strong in the faith. Pray that God would bless the words of my sermons, so they would be used to impact human hearts. Pray for my family and for circumstances related to my move and relocation, that I might focus even more intently on the ministry work at hand. Pray that I'll sense when an idea or plan is good for our church or whether a different course should be taken. And, most importantly, pray that my joy and

love for the Lord will increase, that I might abundantly share it with you and our community.

In return, I pledge to continue praying for you – that the Holy Spirit would enlighten your hearts and draw out your spiritual gifts to be used for God's service. I pray for the Lord to comfort you when you mourn and propel you forward when you are rejoicing. I pray that you will come to know Christ more intimately with each passing day and that you'll be sensitive to the moving of God's Spirit in your life and in the world. I pray that you will be a lamp on a stand and a shining city on a hill, that others would see your deep faith and be drawn to our worshipping community and a relationship with God.

Remember, praying for your pastor – and for one another – is the most helpful and important thing you can do to grow our ministry and increase our devotion to Christ.

Thank you to the congregation for donating to our project to support the Oasis Day Center! On March 11th, Christina Huckile, James Huckile, Grace Stanley and I, delivered a car load of your donations to them. We were given a tour of the facility by the Associate Director, Mary. Every item will be used as they have a regular crowd of people who have no place to call home and others who need a little extra help. The facility is open day from 7am to 5 pm usually serving donuts, cereal or any other donated items. There are showers, lockers, and laundry services Most clients walk over to the Good Samaritan Inn for a hot noon meal, and Oasis tries to provide some 4:00pm meals throughout the week. At closing time, clients can sleep at the Salvation Army or the Water Street Mission....all dependent on random drug testing and breathalyzers. Many clients walk to the Northeast Community Fund for clothing, coats, and food. What an eye opening tour! God calls us to care and provide for others food, clothing, shelter....merely the basics.....whenever we can. If you designate a portion of your weekly offering towards Outreach, a portion of those funds go to many of these organizations on a quarterly basis. HAROLD HARMISON—You Had to Know Him By Kris Huebner DeLong

For years, each time I have tried to describe Harold Harmison to a friend, I have failed to really get at the core of the thing. I usually just find myself saying with a smile, "you just had to know him". At his funeral, earlier this month, I found myself speechless when the pastor asked for eulogies, and I still regret it. It's hard to put into words the impact that someone like Harold has on the world. It's hard also, not to hear his voice saying "Oh c'mon kid! Don't be so melodramatic! Just say what you want to say and do it quickly please. People have things to do."

I want to say thank you, Harold.

Thank you for teaching me to cook pasta, and teaching me so many valuable lessons about life in the process. "Sauce is simple, kid. You only need a few basic ingredients and a little creativity. Throw in whatever you've got handy and taste a lot along the way. The best sauce has no recipe."

Thank you for showing me how to share with abandon. There was never a limit placed on the number of unexpected dinner guests at the Harmison household. All were made to feel welcome; and regardless of how small the pot of pasta looked on the stove, it fed everyone around that table, and the nourishment was often more than just physical.

Thank you for fostering my love of reading, seeking and learning. I say fostering because that's just what you did. My own parents introduced me to the world of books and higher learning; but when adolescence set in, and so many of your young mentees temporarily turned away from the values instilled by their parents, you were there to show us that seeking knowledge was eternally cool.

Thank you for being the anchor that served to hold me back from the precipice overlooking complete stupidity, which I so often danced wildly around. I think many of the youth you served at First Congregational may have avoided unspeakable self-inflicted tragedy, simply because we had a Body of Christ relationship with our church family. We made mistakes, yes. But then we could always come to you and hear your words of wisdom (and sarcasm) and your humble admissions of your own similar teenage stupidity. It made all the difference in the world.

There is so much more I'd like to say. But after paragraph 2, I began to feel your restless desire to interrupt me and tell me to "hurry up". And now that I have reached the sappy part, I can see you looking at the floor with a tear in one eye and telling me that it's not fair to make an old man cry. I've left out the more colorful language you might have used because, after all HH, it is a church newsletter. But, I think anyone who knew you can fill in the blanks.

And I know that anyone who knew you, will never be the same. I thank you for that, as well.



Thank you First Congregational Church for your thoughts and prayers during Harold's illness and after. The service was wonderful and the number of folks who came to pay their respects was quite a tribute to him. I cannot possibly write enough thank you cards, so please, know that my children and I are most grateful. Also, the number of cards I am still receiving warms my heart. Thanks to Bill Huebner and Clarence Elliott for ushering, to Joe Moretti for being the tech guy, to Rev. Jean Pennell for her impromptu piano playing, and to Pastors Ryan Travis and Laurie Hill for their words. I also thank Harold every night for the amazing obituary and service that he wrote some time ago. I had no idea it would be needed so soon! Your prayers are giving me the strength to continue on.

Goal No. 2 - Develop new Outreach ministries to Decatur and the surrounding area.

(Our Outreach Ministry Team has been meeting to get a thorough understanding of our current outreach projects and/or donations. They have plans to visit all the local agencies we support in the coming months and devise a proposal for who we support and at what level.)

Goal No. 3 – (is still "in progress," but will be something around spiritual growth. Pastor Ryan is working on a proposal for this area.)

Pastor Ryan Travis began his ministry with us on February 20 and has been VERY, VERY busy ever since. We had a team of folks who painted, cleaned and updated his office before his arrival. A new computer was purchased and installed, as well as a new window in his door. Many thanks to all who helped get things ready and to everyone who has assisted with the transition of pastoral leadership. God led us to Ryan and Ryan to us – we are truly blessed!

Our outdoor security system is up and running, with the automatic

door unlocking almost completed. A new computer is on order for our Office Manager, which will hopefully put to rest the many computer issues she has dealt with in her time with us. Plans are in the works to update the computer, software and projector in the balcony to enhance our worship services.

I look forward to your continued patience, prayers and support this year. GOD IS GOOD and continues to bless us with new opportunities! We have much to be thankful for and much to be in prayer about. 2017 is shaping up to be another exciting year at First Church and I look forward to continuing to serve as your president.


\$7,598.84 to help the people of Umsning, India,
