From the Pastor

A SACRED SEASON

“Tis the season” and off we run trying to get everything done before December 25th arrives. Yet what is this season? Well, **Advent** is a time to prepare, to open our hearts to the Son of God – born in humble surroundings. A time of new beginnings in our lives and the world. And **Christmas** is a time originally intended to celebrate the birth of Christ; marked by worship, getting together with family and friends and giving gifts. A beautiful season of lights and music. Sadly, also frequently it’s marked by excess of stress, spending, traffic and guilt. **A Question:** Wouldn’t it be wonderful to help each other combine the spirit of Advent and the beauty of Christmas, to simplify a bit, to discover what God’s up to this season and be part of that? Each year we speak of hope, peace, joy and love; what if we live them? What if, with God’s help, we make this a sacred season!

Each week in worship we will remember and celebrate God’s Son coming to our lives and world as we light our Advent Candles. Live out your faith with Advent Acts. Below are some suggestions for simple ways that we can all be a part of God’s rebirth of hope, peace, joy and love in this world with the coming of the Christ Child.

Hope: Week One: Dec. 1-7.

Our Gospel lesson is Matthew 24:36-44. What one thing can you do this week that can help renew hope and lessen fear? Watch for ways God is at work restoring hope in someone’s life. **Advent Acts:** Choose one habit you’ve wanted to break, and begin breaking it; visit a home-bound member; recharge your prayer life; watch less television-spend less time on the internet; donate to a helping agency your talents, time or money; bring food for the local food pantry.

Peace: Week Two: Dec. 8-14.

Our lessons are Matthew 3:1-12. How can you live more the peace of Christ in your life? Commit an act of peacemaking, whether in your own life, the community, or far beyond. Help children to be the best they can be in a safe community. Spend time in quiet, and in prayer listening for Christ’s Spirit in you, in the world, who brings peace to all creation.

Advent Acts: Write a letter to someone from whom you've been estranged or call them; check out the ucc.org website to see what the UCC is doing for peace; pray for peace; write your elected leaders expressing your views for peace and cooperation; learn to communicate, in compassionate, non violent ways.

Joy: Week Three: Dec. 15-21.

Our Gospel lesson is Matthew 11:2-11. Where do you find joy in your life? Is it deep and satisfying or shallow and fleeting? Discover again the joy of God's love – receiving it in your life as well as sharing it with others. In the midst of shopping, planning, rushing about this week, pause and appreciate what brings you joy, whether it is Christmas lights, carols, family time – what ever. Allow yourself time to enjoy. Give a selfless act of kindness to some one in need that you may share joy with another. Advent Acts: Make a list of three simple, free things that bring you joy and try to do at least two of them this week; be a secret Santa, give up one “ought to” activity; give one less gift and write a heartfelt note instead; spend less time in stores shopping and more time with loved ones; come to worship; listen to music; Laugh.

Love: Week One: Dec. 22-24.

Our Gospel lesson is Matthew 1:18-25. What is the most loving thing you can do this week? For God's world, for those you love, for yourself? Advent Acts: Read the Christmas story in Matthew 1 or Luke 2 slowly; send a card with a note or call someone who may be alone this week; read 1 Corinthians 13; be extra patient, extra kind this week; set aside time for those you love and tell how much they mean to you; for that tough relationship-ask yourself what is the most loving thing you can do?; spend quiet time in prayer, opening your heart to receive the love of Christ in whose birth we celebrate!

Christmas Dec. 25 plus the 12 days of Christmas until Epiphany, Luke 2. **You, O God, are born in us and your world today!** “O Come let us adore Him- Christ the Lord!”

WOMEN'S FELLOWSHIP

Paula Cordts recently returned from a trip to China and she has agreed to share her experiences with us on Friday, December 13th. Her experiences involved a lot of one on one with the Chinese and she has some really terrific pictures and tales to share with us. GOD'S BUSY HANDS

Recently a member of Christians In Mission came to our meeting and talked to us about their mission. His talk was very interesting and he told us that the University of Illinois had recently given them 400 bunk beds to give to those in need. However, they do not have enough bedding for these beds. In response to his talk, it was agreed that we would donate 36 of the fleece blankets that we have been working on.

Shirley Zimmerman, who attends second service, was given 100 bed covers by the Fairfield Inn in Forsyth. She felt that our group would find some way to make use of these coverlets. Since they were rather narrow, it was necessary for us to take out the hems on one side and sew two coverlets together to make them big enough for a twin bed. Several of the ladies helped to remove the seams and sewed some of them together. On Thursday afternoon, October 17th, and all day Friday, October 18th, 8 individuals met in Fellowship Hall to sew the coverlets together. Upon completion, 35 coverlets were donated to Christians In Mission.

We are currently working on making fleece blankets for the Pediatric Trauma Unit at a hospital in Minneapolis, MN. This project should result in approximately 40 blankets.

We have also donated blankets to the Cancer Center, a dialysis unit in Decatur and Baby Talk, just to name a few.

As you can see, we live up to our name of God's Busy Hands.

This group is open to anyone who may wish to join us. You do not need any special talents, just a willingness to help others.
