## THE BEST GIFT

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son That whosoever believes in Him, Shall not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16

"What makes Christmas special? I asked a group young children. "Jesus!" shouted some of them while others said "Presents!" For many of us, presents are an important part of Christmas. ## Giving Envelopes

"Why am I getting these?" "I give electronically, I don't need these." "What a waste of postage." These are phrases heard when the following year's giving envelopes arrive in the mail. Actually, it is not a waste of postage. If we were to mail each packet individually, it would be \$2.24 cents each. The cheapest postage rate is for a mailing of 200 pieces and we don't have near that many. The next cheapest rate we are able to take advantage of is 50 lbs. and it involves mailing to just about everyone. So, if you give electronically, or once a year, or quarterly, and have no need for a packet, just bring it back to the church and we can use the contents as pew envelopes. Or another idea – put a dollar or loose change in them every so often. As always, thank you for your donations to First Congregational United Church of Christ in Decatur.




