FROM THE PASTOR

Year after year we celebrate Thanksgiving in our family. In the early days we would gather at my grandparents home and share our family special foods: Chicken and Dumplings and Cannederli, glazed carrots and creamed peas (ugh), mashed potatoes and gravy. Pumpkin Pie and warm Cinnamon coffeecake. I was young enough to need to sit on huge phonebooks – 2 of them. Great Grandma Nona and Grandpa Tullio would speak in Italian. My dad and uncle would translate. My Grandma Dorothy and Great Grandma Mayme would roll their eyes. It was great! At least until Great Grandma Mayme died.

Our family changed. Three years later my brother was born and Grandpa Tullio died and our family changed again. Three years later my second brother was born and Great Grandma Nona died and our family changed again. We still gathered as family but now there was a deaf 3 year old and a high chair. Our three elders had gone, new small children arrived. The food was the same and the traditions were passed on. But we learned something.

As a family we learned that we have much to be thankful for.....people who love one another (if rather loudly in Italian sometimes). We have foods that give the holiday gathering meaning. We have one another in times of love and joy, birth and death, times of struggle and times of plenty. In other words, we are Family.

Christ calls us together as His Family of faith and on those special holy days when we gather together at table or at Table, we remember and share love and joy, birth and death, times of struggle and times of plenty as brothers and sisters in Christ, children of God.

As each of you sit down to enjoy food and fellowship during this holiday season, remember what life as a Family of faith has taught us: lighten the darkness in this world, make rough paths smooth, love one another as Christ has loved us and our neighbor as ourselves, serve others and share Christ with the world.

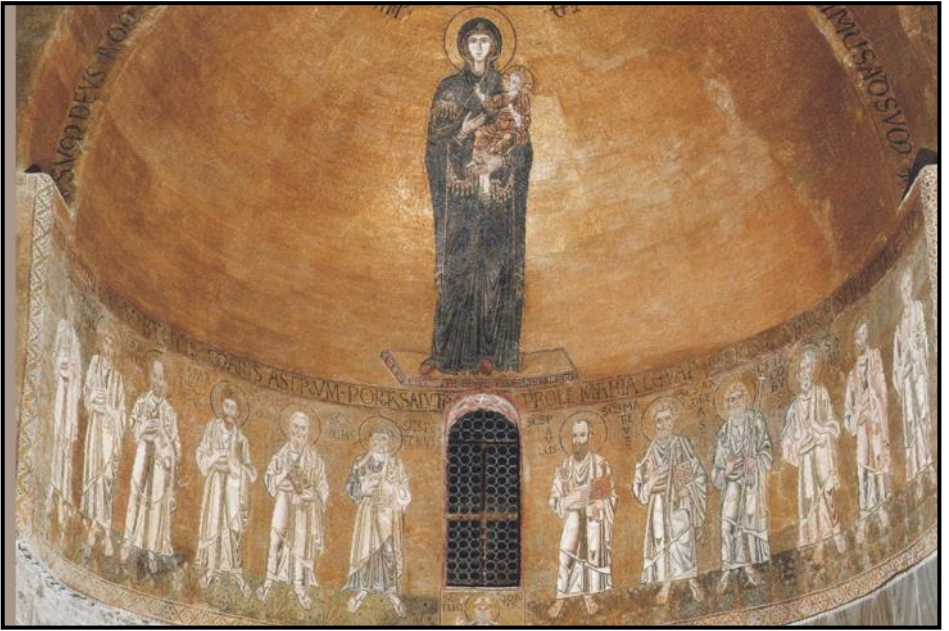
