What a wonderful day Valentine's Day is. Where did it come from? One legend contends that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When

Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death.

Valentine Day is a day dedicated to the positive feelings of the heart...one day of the year to contemplate the wonders of love. The glorious truth is that God unconditionally shares God's love with us every day. We see the wonders of God's love for us in nature, listening to good music, pondering new ideas, reading scriptures. We can see examples of love in family and friends and other people. We can even feel God's love in our own hearts. We experience God's love and forgiveness through Jesus' ministry and when he gave his life on the cross so that we might have life. Dear Friends of First Church and beyond,

I want to thank you for your caring prayers, kind words and thoughtful cards for my family and I during this time of grief. These expressions of kindness have given us strength and comfort knowing that we go through this time with your caring support and with God's uplifting Spirit.

My sincere thanks to Marsha Mower, to Admin members, Rev. Mark Schleeter and many of you for your supportive work enabling our First Church ministry's to continue to provide what is needed during my grief leave.

What happened?

James Everett Taylor, my Dad (in Largo FL), on Sunday, Dec. 29th had severe back pain and activated his Life Alert button and he was taken to the hospital. He was diagnosed with Sciatica and was treated with pain medication. They also discovered of a slow heart beat that they addressed with medication. Doctors indicated that he was doing fine and would be released to a rehab/nursing care facility. He was transferred Friday evening to the care facility. Dad and I talked after he was settled and he sounded good - I teased that I was going to send him a box of snow and he laughed. The next morning Jan 4th 6 AM the nursing staff found Dad breathing shallowly and was unresponsive. They called the paramedics and he was "coded" more than once on their return to hospital. He was in a coma. The hospital staff did all they could – but determined that he had suffered significant brain injury. Sat. afternoon, Jan. 4th after having conversations with the medical staff - per Dad's request through his Living Will - we made the decision to discontinue the heroic medical measures. He died peacefully. We give thanks for Dad's life. We give thanks that Dad is past all illness and death and he is with God in life eternal. Mom and Dad had been married 66 years. Dad chose to live, alone, the last 2 1/2 years in their home, making his own decisions - not moving to an assisted living facility. He lived life "his way." We will have a family time of faith and remembrance for Dad soon. Your prayers for our family during this time are greatly appreciated.


