will join me in making your spiritual life a priority for 2014.



FOODS RESOURCE BANK

Here is a wrap-up on the Foods Resource Bank growing project for 2013.

We had a fun September Harvest Celebration in the field, with combine and wagon rides for all. Our corn crop made a record-breaking 212 bushels per acre! But, the market price had dropped and we only sold for \$4.40 a bushel. This is just the opposite of last year when we had a high price with low yield. With this sale amount added to the funds donated to the FRB growing project, we have \$7,128.14 for our donation to Foods Resource Bank.

Ten percent of this amount was designated to the general operating expenses of the Foods Resource Bank and the remaining 90 percent supports a sustainable food program in Kenya. This program is teaching the people of Kenya conservation agriculture and application of manure and crop residue to improve soil and water-retention qualities. The people are learning to plant in trenches where they have replaced the rocky soil with more suitable planting material. Small animals such as rabbits, goats and chickens are "loaned" from which the families are expected to pass on offspring to other families. It is hoped that the children who have left school to help their parents in the work force will be able to go back to school when the food supply is more stable. If you are interested in learning more about this program, check out the reports from FRB visits on the Outreach bulletin board in Fellowship Hall.

Thanks to all for helping the people of Kenya experience the dignity and pride of feeding themselves.


