

Happy New Year! May the coming year be kind and generous to each of you!

Romans 12: 9-21 Marks of the True Christian Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for

what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.' No, 'if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads.' Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Since this is January and many folks are making New Year's Resolutions, let's begin our new year off in a good way! There is a little booklet called The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Churches and the converse of that is on the flip side: The 7 Habits of Highly Ineffective Churches. Let's take a look at our church and see which Habits we need to break and which ones we need to do better! We begin with the Effective Church side of the booklet:

- A. Strive for excellence in service to Christ
- B. Cultivate a spirit of innovation and experimentation
- C. Take the initiative to build relationships with people and groups in the wider community beyond your congregation
- D. Accept responsibility for mistakes, learn from them, and in all things, let grace abound
- E. Always be prepared to give an account of the hope that is within you
- F. Be willing to let people go in order to stay focused on your core mission
- G. Err on the side of Generosity

And now for the Ineffective church side of the booklet:

- A. Elevate mediocrity to a spiritual discipline
- B. Take no risks
- C. Practice the following evangelism strategy: If they want us, they know where to find us
- D. Blame early and often
- E. Always be prepared to make an account of the excuses that are within you
- F. The job of the Pastor(s) and staff is to keep everyone, meaning church members, happy
- G. Spend as little money as possible

As your church looks for a new pastor, which type of church do you think a pastor would want to come and be with; minister with? Obviously, the Effective Church! While there is no perfect church (or perfect pastors) a pastor will be drawn to the churches that exhibit most of the first group of 'habits'. But do not despair! If First Church has Ineffective habits, now is the time to change them! From what I have seen, the members of First Church are more the Effective Habits Church than the Ineffective Habits Church, but we can always do better!


