

FROM THE PASTOR

"Remember Who You Are"

Bobbie and I first heard the phrase "Remember Who You Are" in a sermon given by my Preaching Professor on

the 10th Anniversary of my Ordination. Rev. Dr. Hale Schroer shared that while he was in high school and he was getting ready to head out for an evening of fun with his friends, his father wouldn't recite a long list of "do's" and "don'ts" or rules, but simply said, "Hale, remember who you are."

Those simple words have become part our family. When Christen and Aaron were old enough to go off to activities on their own, Bobbie and I would often say as part of our goodbyes, "Aaron/Christen, remember who you are." Remembering who they are in relation to our family means that they know they are greatly loved and valued. We encouraged them to live out their family values even when we're not standing beside them.

It is sometimes hard to remember who we are in a world of peer pressure, advertising bombardment, and unlimited options. We sometimes bow to the pressure to be someone we are not and never can be, or someone we don't need to be. We need God's help to live good lives.

Just as family heritage can remind us of who we are, our baptism also tells us in the most profound sense who we are and whose we are. Baptism gives us our true name as daughters and son of God. In the family of God's belonging, we know we are wondrously loved and greatly valued. For God so loved the world (us and all people) that He gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. That 's amazing love and we are part of it.

Jesus created a community of faith where people came to remember who they were and to whom they belonged. That community is the Christian Church. You and I gather here at First Congregational UCC to hear again the faith stories of our family and remember how we are part of them...Queen Esther, a woman of courage; David, a shepherd, slayer of evil giants, to name a few. Even when our ancestors messed up big time like the Prodigal Son, we hear how God is merciful, forgiving, and welcoming, offering the sinner another chance at life. These faith stories give us hope and new life in Jesus Christ. It is in his love that we are forgiven and loved, free to grow and become all that God envisions us to be.

The Power of Three

Recently, three churches in central Illinois gathered for a day of Worship, Recreation, Bible Study and Family Time with the theme, "The Reality of LOGOS." Our churches have all had LOGOS for many years - Mt. Zion Presbyterian (27 years), First Congregational (12 years), Westminster Presbyterian (10 years) - so we decided to hold a day of sharing our experiences and to build relationships among the churches. Representatives from each church spent many hours planning the

day. Our goal was to re-energize the volunteers and to remind us why we are doing this ministry. As churches with this kind of longevity, it is easy to fall into the rut of doing the same things each year and often forgetting the most important goal, "To bring children and youth into a right relationship with God through Jesus Christ." After all,



that is the *most important* thing a church will *ever* do. We designed our day to include:

- Experiencing each of the 4 parts, goal of each, and how they all fit together
- Calling people to serve
- Why we do the ministry
- Discipline
- GenOn Ministry Realities and Convictions

We finished our day with the ministers from each church leading us in worship and sharing communion together. During our worship, we included the activities we learned in our Worship Skills section (interpretive movement to The Lord's Prayer and Freeze Frame). Our high school youth from each church provided the childcare, giving them an opportunity to get to know each other, as well as the attenders of the event. It was a wonderful day with 40 people in attendance! The responses we heard were very positive. We came away from the day with the conviction to do this again, and to share more events through-

out the year. We are making plans to do mission work in our community together as well. We are energized, full of new ideas, have some new friends, and feel ready to plan for a new and exciting year of LOGOS in our churches



FIRST CHURCH FOODS RESOURCE BANK GROWING PROJECT

It's time to start our 2013 FRB growing project!

Can you believe this is our 8th year to be a part of the Foods Resource Bank program?

As in past years, a church member has donated 5 acres of farmland for the project and has volunteered the equipment and labor to plant, care for, and harvest a corn crop for our project. Now church members have the opportunity to "sponsor an acre" by giving cash to cover the cost of the input expenses of our corn crop. The proceeds from the harvest will be sent to a Foods Resource Bank sustainable food program in Kenya. One hundred percent of the money that we send is passed on to the program that we have selected. Nothing is held out for overhead.

This year's cost of planting our project is \$430.50 per acre. The breakdown per acre is:

\$ 139.00 for seed 202.00 for fertilizer 32.00 for herbicide 25.00 for fungicide 22.50 for diesel fuel 10.00 for crop hail insurance

Therefore, the total amount needed to plant our corn crop this year is \$2152.50. Our current crop is about 12 inches tall and is receiving its second spraying of herbicide to kill weeds in the field.

If you would like to make a donation to help pay the cost of planting this crop, donation envelopes can be found on the bulletin boards and in the pews and may be placed in the offering baskets or delivered to the church office. Please make your check payable to First Congregational UCC, and indicate that it is for our FRB growing project.

It's almost time for VBS 2013 at First Church. We will have an amazing experience that will help kids (and adults) explore God's incredible love for his children. This is a church-wide endeavor and we always have room for anyone that would like to help out!

Our theme is *Kingdom Rock – Where Kids Stand Strong for God*. We will meet Truman, Duke, Swift, Sir Valiant and Victoria as they help us with our daily Bible Point, Story and Key Verse. The dates are <u>Sunday</u>, July 21 – <u>Thursday</u>, July 25 from 6:00-8:30, with the preschool children having the option of leaving at 8:05 and dinner available for the volunteers at 5:15 (\$3 per person, per evening).

<u>Primary areas of need include</u> sound/projection, crew leaders and helpers for preschool and registration. We will also need help with set-up and take-down and bulletin boards.

There is no charge to attend VBS, but the cost runs approximately \$25 per week (\$5 per day), per child. Included in the program again this year is a mission project. We have purchased "God's Love for You" Bible books – a kid-friendly Scripture piece, written in Hindi – that will be sent to children in India. Throughout the week, our VBS participants will interact with the Bible books and during the family craft time on Thursday evening, the books will be personalized.
