

A Note from Pastor Jan



July 2019

This month we celebrate Independence Day! The 4th of July has become a time of band concerts and with them comes the fireworks. There are family picnics with hotdogs, potato salad, chips, lemonade, and watermelon OR there are picnics with ribs and 7 layer salads and red, white, and blue desserts made from berries and cool whip, with iced tea and French fries. Or you just go out to eat and let the ants starve! The celebration is always great and the togetherness makes our hearts beat proud. We Americans treasure our Independence! And yet we all know that we are not independent! We celebrate the independence won for a fledgling country in 1776 that

has now become a great melting pot of a country with people from all corners of the world who come together to celebrate US – a United States! My heritage is Italian, Scotch-Irish, and Cherokee. My husband's was German and Swedish. My daughter is part Polish and Lithuanian and my son is Thai and Chinese. The first Christmas Dang was with us we signed our Christmas Cards: The United Nations with our birth names and Dang's in Thai script. Only in America could we have 4 people with a 9 country heritage!

We are not Independent! We are INTERDEPENDENT. From birth until we can walk, we are fully Dependent. And even after that we are dependent upon parents. When we leave home we are more Independent — although, there are still strings of Dependence that hold us together as family. Eventually, however, we are no longer Dependent, nor are we Independent! To grow into responsible adults, we must become INTER-dependent. That would be a spiritual designation as well as a mental or psychological designation. We need one another! Together we have liberty — apart we have emptiness.

As Christians, we celebrate liberty – the freedom to come and go (within bounds) as we please and as it pleases God. God sets the boundaries of our liberty. In Christ we are free from that which enslaves us: sin. Those 10 Commandments and Jesus' additional commands, hold us fast in the heart of God! Our true freedom comes from our dependency upon Christ's sacrifice and through God's grace and mercy.

Galatians 5: 1-13, For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.....For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another.

Children and Youth Summer Outreach Project

Childrens. Youth and Outreach ministries are teaming up to help with disaster relief in this country and around the world. This summer, we will be collecting items for School Kits and Hygiene Kits as a part of Church World Service's disaster relief. We are also supporting the nurses at DMH with Hope Kits to send home with needy mothers with newborns and for babies who are going directly into foster care.

A list of specific items needed will be posted and published as well as a poster showing the progress towards our goal of 50 School Kits, 50 Hygiene Kits and 25 Newborn Hope Kits.

HYGIENE KITS

One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or microfiber)

One washcloth

One wide-tooth comb

One fingernail or toenail clipper

One bath-size bar of soap

One toothbrush in the package

Ten standard size Band-Aids

SCHOOL KITS

One pair of blunt scissors (rounded tip, only)

Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose leaf or filler paper)

One 30-centimeter /12" ruler

One hand-held pencil sharpener

One large eraser (no pencils with erasers)

Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers

One box of 24 crayons

NEWBORN HOPE KITS

One sleep and play outfit

Three onesie undershirts

Two burp cloths

One pack newborn diapers

One pack diaper wipers

Baby body wash and shampoo

Growing Hope



Formerly Foods Resource Bank

Our Growing Hope growing project has been planted and is about 6 inches tall. The corn crop is currently at the V5 growth stage, which means the plant has five mature leaf collars. The crop is transitioning from using the seed reserves to developing its roots to gather nutrients.

Now is the time for members and friends to help support the costs of the growing project. This year the cost for one acre is \$373 and breaks down as:

\$140 corn seed

\$145 fertilizer

\$ 40 herbicide

\$ 25 fungicide

\$ 11 diesel fuel

\$ 12 crop hail insurance

Therefore, with a 5-acre growing project, we are needing \$1,865 to cover the input costs for this year.

As in the past, the farmland, labor and equipment to plant, grow and harvest our crop is donated.

If you would like to participate in this project, there are envelopes in the church pews and on the bulletin board in Fellowship Hall, or you may mark your donation "Growing Hope Globally" and the money counters will get it in the appropriate account. This is the 14th growing project for our church and these proceeds will benefit people in West Africa to help them become food sustainable and never go hungry again.


