FROM THE PASTOR

THE SEASON OF LENT

Imagine you have been given 40 days to do nothing but focus on getting your life in order. Time to take stock, figure out what's working and what is not, conduct a spiritual, emo-

tional, and physical house-cleaning, spend all the time you've ever wanted reading what you wanted to read, read and reflect on the scriptures, listening to great music, time for prayer, talking with a mentor, or cherished friend, spending time in solitude.

Few of us ever find such an uncluttered opportunity. What we do have, is Lent. And while we may not be able to take off from work and family duties, there is plenty we *can* do.

We can stop. Set aside 20 minutes per day, preferably all together, but it can be divided into 5-10 minute segments if needed, to stop and breathe, clear our heads and listen to God.

We can pray. Begin the habit now and by Easter it will be as natural as breathing. Whisper your thanks to God in the morning for another day. Use the simple breath prayer, "God, you are here, I am here," off and on throughout the day. Call to mind people who are in need, and "lift them up to God". You can pick up devotional material here at church such as "These Days" to help you grow in your faith.

We can practice spiritual discipline. Give up something that has become a little too important in our lives like -- a certain food? Video games? TV? Computer/Internet? Cell phone? -- and make space for God. Rediscover again our true priorities and our true identity as Children of God. Write down your questions, your prayers requests, your spiritual discoveries, answers to your prayers, the closeness of God in your life – to help you grow in your faith. Give anonymously to good causes that help God's people in need. Ask or offer forgiveness where needed. Make amends.

We can take inventory: what have I allowed to clutter up my

life? What do I need to “shed”? Whom or what have I neglected? What one change could I make in my life that would leave me feeling more positive, energized and hopeful?

We can get involved. Help serve a meal to the hungry at Good Samaritan. Help a student with reading or math as a tutor at their school. Learn about a current social justice issue. Help your community become stronger and more caring – working toward solutions for the neediest in our midst.

We can worship. On Sunday mornings we are not just a collection of individuals doing our own thing. We are responding to God’s invitation to be a beloved community.

We may not have the luxury of stepping away from our real lives for the next few weeks of Lent, but we have a rich, opportunity filled, time in which draw us ever closer to God who draws near to one another. May this season be filled with surprising blessings, fruitful reflections, and new spiritual growth for all of us.

INFORMATION ON KROGER REWARDS CARDS

Linking Your Kroger Rewards Card to the New Community Rewards Program

Our First Congregational United Church of Christ number is **10619**.
TO USE THE KROGER COMMUNITY REWARDS PROGRAM:

Simply register online at krogercommunityrewards.com

- Be sure to have your Kroger Plus card handy and register your card with your organization after you sign up.
- If a member does not yet have a Kroger Plus card, please let them know that they are available at the customer service desk at any Kroger.
- Click on Sign In/Register
- Most participants are new online customers, so they must click on SIGN UP TODAY in the 'New Customer?' box.
- Sign up for a Kroger Rewards Account by entering zip code, clicking on favorite store, entering your email address and creating a password, agreeing to the terms and conditions
- You will then get a message to check your email inbox and click on the link within the body of the email.
- Click on My Account and use your email address and password to proceed to the next step.
- *At this point I had to click on "Community" in the top tabs, then on Community Rewards in the dropdown.*
- Click on Edit Kroger Community Rewards information and input your Kroger Plus card number.
- Update or confirm your information.
- Enter NPO number or name of organization, select organization from list and click on confirm.
- To verify you are enrolled correctly, you will see your organization's name on the right side of your information page.
- REMEMBER, purchases will not count for your group until after your member(s) register their card(s).
- Do you use your phone number at the register? Call [800-576-4377](tel:800-576-4377), select option 4 to get your Kroger Plus card number.

Members must swipe their registered Kroger Plus card or use the phone number that is related to their registered Kroger Plus card when shopping for each purchase to count.


SAVE THIS DATE!
