

From the Pastor Discount Ministry? No Way!

Americans are discount conscious. How else to explain

the increase of discount shopping malls that dot our interstate highways? How else to explain the rise of huge discount stores Wal-Mart, K-Mart, Sam's Club and simultaneously, the demise of the "mom and pop" downtown stores? How else to explain the offerings by American automakers for new car rebates, and no interest loans? How else to explain the many garage sales? We all like bargains.

America is discount conscious. We assume that all services can and ought to be discounted, that full payment is never necessary. Not so in the church of Jesus Christ. Not so in the true expressions of our faith and love. Not so in the church called First Congregational United Church of Christ. Do we provide curriculum to only a quarter of our Sunday School or VBS students, or sheet music for just a quarter of the choir members? Ridiculous isn't it? We cannot exist on discount faith or discount giving.

While realizing our nation's flat economy, I want you to know that First Church is operating at a deficit at this time - as it has in the past. A number of "bad weather" Sundays in 2014 has resulted in lower worship attendance and offerings given. Your safety always comes first when the bad weather is present. Yet regardless of the weather our bills still come due each month. Our budget, though significant at \$208,968.58 is not fluff filled. Our belt has been cinched tighter. The incoming and outgoing dollar is monitored very closely. An older building with higher energy and maintenance costs, salaries, insurance, programming and administrative costs, as well as our UCC conference and national responsibilities easily account for the budget figure.

Simply put, our ministry budget demands more cost than we are presently giving. In the past we have had reserves to draw on yet much of the reserve is committed to needed maintenance projects.

What Can Be Done?

- 1) **PRAY** for your church, not just to be able to pay our bills, but to help us understand and do our mission together in this place, at this time.
- 2) **Verify** near the end of April you'll received your Statement of Giving is it correct? Is your pledge current? Does your statement reflect what you want to give to God?
- 3) Increase your giving through a "Second Mile Gift". Every gift helps.
- 4) Make the support of your church a regular part of your weekly or monthly budget. Know that your support makes a holy difference by investing in God's future now. Look at the wonderful LOGOS, Sunday School and Youth programs filling children and adults with faith, food and fun touching lives inside and outside our church walls.
- 5) Use your Bible to look up scriptural passages on giving that may help in your faith decision. Here are a few suggestions: Matthew 6:19-21, 14:13-21, 25:14-30 Mark 12:29-30, 41-44, Luke 12:13-21,48, 16:1-13 1 Corinthians 4:1-2, 2 Corinthians 8: 1-15, 9:6-15, Galatians 5:22-23, Ephesians 3:1-21, 1 Timothy 6:6-10, 17-19
- 6) Consider moving toward the biblical standard of a full tithe (10% of your income) as your faith commitment to God and your support of First Church.
- 7) Support your church through your time, talents, and financial resources as your church leadership acts on a variety of ideas to help grow First Church.

Will we rise in Christ's Spirit and meet the challenge or will we seek a discounted ministry for First Church? I believe we can meet this challenge because, *TOGETHER*, *WE CAN do all things through CHRIST who strengthens us*.

Come join us at First Congregational UCC Church on Sundays at 9 and 11 AM for worship and 10 AM for Sunday School and Fellowship Time with delicious refreshments. Come as we discover and live together what it means to be part of God's love here and in the world. In Christ's Love,

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." - John 13: 34-35

No one really uses the word "maundy" anymore in their daily lives. Which is why today can seem a little murkier than some of the other holy days in Lent. We get Ash Wednesday, and Palm Sunday, and Good Friday...but what's "Maundy Thursday"?

The word "maundy" comes from a Latin word: *mandatum*. And mandatum means "mandate" or a "commandment." And when we talk about "Maundy Thursday" we're talking about "mandate Thursday." We're talking about the night before he died, when Christ told his disciples exactly what he expected them to do next.

And if you read a book or watch a movie about almost anyone else, you might think the lead character right about now would be saying something like "avenge my death" or "make sure there's payback" or "don't let them get away with this ... strike back."

But this isn't any other story. This is a story that turns everything on its head. Instead, the mandate that Jesus gives is this: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

It's not my job to rename Christian holy days. But if it were, I might change the name of Maundy Thursday. I might change it from this word that none of us really know anymore to something we would all understand. Something like "Love One Another Thursday" or "The Last Thing Christ Really Wanted Us to Know Thursday."

There's a song that many of us learned as children: "and they'll know we are Christians by our love, by our love...and they'll know we are Christians by our love." It might not sound all that radical...but it is. It's a song that reminds us of Christ's true mandate. And it's still the gauge of how well we are following him. Because, if we take Christ's word for it, love is more than our mandate as Christians. It's our calling card.

Prayer

God of love, help us to remember the mandate that Christ has given to us, on this sacred Thursday, and always. And God, may they know we are Christians by our love. Amen.


VBS 2014
