### "WE'VE A STORY TO TELL TO THE NATIONS..."

So begins one of my favorite hymns which I learned in Sunday School a number of years ago.

We learn who we are from the stories we hear and identify with. What is your favorite story of

courage and caring?

God's story is our story because of God's grace. It is our story because Jesus, God's son, one of us, lived among us, died for us, was raised from the dead, and unites us with God and God's family. We know the reality of that story in our own lives and in the life of the church. We have experienced God's love in our lives. Who hasn't felt like the "Prodical Son"- experiencing the pain of separation and hurt as well as the healing power of forgiveness, of hope and love?

#### **We have a story to tell.**

In this 124th year of First Congregational United Church, we recall how God has worked through faithful people - that we, today may receive and pass that faith on. In the children's game "Telephone" a message is heard by one child then the child must whisper it accurately to next person. Each person is a vital link to passing the message on...so the last person can receive the message. What happens when one person doesn't pass the message on? All of those after that person miss hearing the message. Are you passing on God's message to your family, friends, neighbors, co-workers -even strangers? Who isn't hearing God's message in our Decatur community?

Each of us -from the youngest child to the our oldest member...we've a story to share. God is still speaking to each of us. Through prayer, and mission, through devotional study, worship, Sunday School, LOGOS, VBS, Women's, and Youth fellowships and Outreach Ministry God's story and our story is being told.

God's message speaks in quiet ways as we serve a plate of food and share a smile with a person in need at our funeral dinners, in the hats and mittens we make and collect for children in our community, in listening as a friend, families in need receiving food baskets at Thanksgiving, in teaching the faith in Sunday School or LOGOS, VBS through voices and instruments music enhances our worship together, in visiting in friendship, working on Food Resource Bank project, and

in so many more caring and creative ways.

A new pew leaflet is being developed explaining our worship traditions for our visitors. Our evangelism and worship leaflets will be in our pews and in our church office. **God is faithful;**

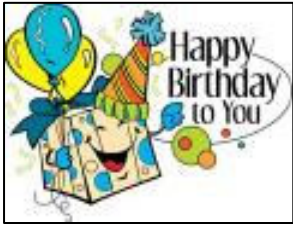
**Christ's love is always with us giving us hope that we may share that hope with everyone.**
