PRAYING OUR EVERYDAY EXPERIENCES

How often do we take time to reflect upon the experiences of our everyday lives while gently asking the question, "God, how and where were you with me to-day?" Too often we rush through our day and headlong into bed

without breaking stride. Perhaps we may not live the rushed life, but we simply live our days without giving much thought to prayer or God. But how much we could learn if we began the practice of daily reflection.

When we examine our daily experience with a quiet and prayerful heart, often we become aware of occasions when we are being blessed and nurtured by God without knowing it. Perhaps a kind word from a stranger or friend gave us hope or delight, or something beautiful caught our eye or ear. Perhaps a task well done brought a satisfying sense of using our gifts to do God's will, or we found ourselves reaching out to someone in love and care.

When we recall such moments, our natural response will be gratitude. As we savor the blessing once again, it continues to nourish us and give us life. This experience of gratitude and renewed vitality can be an important indicator that we are living "in sync" with God's desires for our life.

Of equal importance are our experiences of our being "out of sorts" - those moments when we feel drained and anxious, disconnected from people, when we act in ways that make us apologize for "not being myself." These moments also are important to notice and hold, and can help us to recognize those activities and conditions that may be out of line with God's desires. An important service to the church or the community, if it continues to drain all your energy and spirit, may not be the service God is asking you to perform. Or perhaps the Holy Spirit is encouraging you to attend to other dimensions of your life, such as family relationships or recreation.

Over time, the practice of daily reflection can help us to become more aware of the presence of God in even the most insignificant experiences of life, and to discern how the Holy Spirit is encouragencouraging us to live ways that enable us to give and receive love more freely, to glorify and enjoy God, and to use our energy for the building up of Christ's realm.

We invite you to join us in worship at 9:00 AM Sundays Traditional Service with opportunities of Sunday School and Bible Study and 11:00 AM for our Contemporary Service and 10:00 AM for fellowship and refreshments in Fellowship Hall.



- we have helped Haitian immigrants in the Dominican Republic eat better, farm better and read better,
- and the last 2 years we have helped improve the life of the people of North Korea.

Over the last six years we have contributed over \$45,000 to these sustainable food programs, teaching people in the poorest areas of the world to feed themselves. God's Busy Hands

A report on the progress of the blanket programs you so generously support:

In mid February I informed you of the request for 100 blankets for the Springfield area military deployment. These needed to be turned in by the end of May. We have surrendered 49 blankets to that Project Linus program and have 41 more ready to go.

We are continuing to make blankets for this program as well as concurrently making and providing blankets for the Regions Pediatric Trauma Center in Minneapolis. We also continue to provide blankets for Mano a Mano to be used in their Bolivia work. About a year ago Dan Narr, Executive Director U.S. Mano a Mano International Partners, presented a program in fellowship hall explaining the Mano a Mano program in Bolivia.

We calculate we have created about 2,025 blankets since our inception in 2008!

This group also continues to knit prayer shawls, caps and mittens. We have given a total of 60 Prayer Shawls or Lap Robes. We have 12 Prayer Shawls ready to go as needed.

Carolyn Strong knitted and donated 50 pair of mittens in various sizes. Betty Wheatley knitted 45 - 50 caps also scarves (as a guess 25). Over the years purchased mittens, caps and scarves of an unknown number were donated.

The DOMESTIC VIOLENCE program provides assistance and support to clients in five counties: Macon, Moultrie, Piatt, Shelby and DeWitt. These are just a few of the programs that DOVE supports with your help. As you can see, the need is great and your help is always appreciated.
