

ands: Connor and Gavin Butts and Mitchell Daley. October 16 is Children's Sabbath and the class will be writing parts of that service as well as leading worship. Make sure to join us for worship that day! Each month we will engage in a Jesus-has-left-the-building experience: a trip to Rock Springs Park to build community, Eastern-Western Association Meeting, collecting and delivering food to a food pantry or soup kitchen. Each week we will 'stay connected' with email questions that will need to be responded to from the Student's Journal 'Affirming Faith'. Each student will select a Biblical character to research and discover a Bible character that is most like him! You may even find a little Confirmation Article in the newsletter each month as well!

Mentors will be selected and are welcome to join us for a variety of activities and are encouraged to sit in worship with the students. And in the Spring, Bryan Sirchio will be the keynoter for the Association meetings – the Confirmands will know some of his music because they will use it to memorize books if the Bible (ABC's for the OT and New Testament Rap) and the 10 Commandments(Live the 10) and Beattitudes (The Beattitudes) and Disciples (The Disciples) and some of Bryan's songs will be at the center of our conversations about mission (The Wooden Bell) and evangelism (Bumper-sticker Witness), and the theological themes of acceptance (The Cold Shower Treatment) and stewardship (Put It in the Hands of Jesus).

Here's what you can do for the Confirmands and their parents: provide pizza once a month and pray. Volunteer to be a mentor and pray. Help with transportation to 'off campus' activities and pray.

It'll be a great year, but the experience will be even greater if the members of First Church get behind the kids and support what they are doing! And Pray!

A Love Story - Chapter 1

After worship we all trudged out to the parking lot and bundled into cars and trucks and headed off to live out our faith in whatever way we could, trying to make sense of God's all inclusive love in our lives.

My family was like most of the families in our church. We attended worship and Sunday School and God's Kids youth group. My dad was a school teacher and served on the church council, he refereed basketball games at the local Jr. High and taught driver's education during the summer. My mom was also a school teacher but she taught Special students. One day I asked her what was Special about her students and she said that they loved to be at school!

While my dad's students were challenging at times, my mom's students were challenged. Some of them couldn't walk, some of them couldn't talk, some of them were very smart but had problems with, uhhhhh, bodily functions. Mom said she was always touched by how they related to her and to one another. They help one another to do the jobs they are given. I had a hard time understanding it when mom said one of her student's worked all year just to be able to sit up. And one student actually cried when her 'sitting' student got the job done. This made me think. "Why does God make kids like this if they can't do anything except sit up?" So I asked Him.

When Sunday came, I couldn't wait to get to church! Mom asked me if I felt ok. She felt my forehead to see if I had a temperature. Sometimes she is just weird! I went straight to our pastor's office and found him at that big desk. All of a sudden I was nervous. Maybe I shouldn't have come here. Maybe I should just wait until we shake hands after the service to ask him. But he looked up and saw me. Well, nothing to do but go in now! I gathered my courage around me like a blanket and crept in. Pastor asked me if he could help me. I bit my lower lip and told him I needed to know something. He smiled and said he would answer almost any question I had or he would be happy to find the answer to my question if he didn't know it. Ok! Deep breath! I looked at his face and it was very kind and gentle looking. He probably wouldn't be angry with me. So I said, "If God is so loving and loves everybody, why did He make the kids in my mom's class?" and I told him about the student who worked all year trying to sit up and the one who cried when it happened the first time. I told him about the kids who couldn't walk and the ones who couldn't talk. I told him I thought it was mean of God to make people like that. And I told him, feeling rather ashamed, that I told God that He was mean.

"I see," said our pastor, his eyes still kind and gentle. "Are you going to be at God's Kids this afternoon?"

"Sure!" I said. "God's Kids is always fun!"

"Good! I'll be there too! And I think I'll have some answers for you. Or at least I'll give you some alternative ideas to consider."

I looked at pastor and he said, "God really doesn't make mistakes. It's just that our experiences in life don't always include Divine wisdom. Maybe tonight you will be able to find a little of that Divine wisdom."

"OK, pastor. Can I still ask questions?" I really needed to ask questions.

"I can't imagine you not asking questions! Ask away. But I have a suspicion you won't need to ask much tonight." Boy, sometimes pastor is downright mysterious.

That afternoon at God's Kids....

The youth leader welcomed us all and we all grabbed bags of chips and sodas and sat in a circle on the floor in our youth room. We all love our youth room because we got to decorate it the way we wanted. There's a soft rug on the floor and big pillows for us to sit on. We have a soda machine that we keep filled and recycle the cans. We have some books that we use to have our devotions each week. And we have a piano that we can play on and some of our group, use it to practice their piano lessons. We have a white wall so we can show movies on it and a programmable keyboard so we can listen to music or play it ourselves and a Wii. We love having lock-ins and we get to

take a mission trip every couple of years when we make enough money. We go to places in the cities and also in rural areas and sometimes we just help people right here in our own town.

Today when we sat on the rug and had our devotions, the pastor came and sat with us. He said he was glad to see us all and that he had some friends coming in a little while but first he wanted to talk to us.

He told us about a place not too far away from our town that he knew of called A Caring Place. That's a place where kids live because they have problems walking and talking. I thought I knew what was coming. He was going to tell us about all the gross things – kids with no legs or no arms or who can't talk and have to be in diapers. But he didn't say any of those things. He said that once the kids got here we were to welcome them and do things with them. Then he asked us what we thought we could do together.

One girl asked if they could have snacks. Pastor said some of the visitors could have snacks but others would bring their own. A guy friend of mine asked if they would like to see a movie. Pastor said, "You should ask them if they want to see a movie when they get here. But I think they might like to get to know you all first."

"We could play a 'get to know' you game" I said, "but how can the kids who do not talk, play that?" "Well, those kids have special equipment that will help them. I think you will be really surprised at how much they really can do and also how much like you they are!" Then it was time to greet them.To Be Continued.....

Growing a Church

Growing a church is much like growing a garden. There was a church in North Kansas City that was known as the Joy Church. Wouldn't that be wonderful to be known as the Joy Church? It is up to us to define our church to the community, to prepare the soil.

We also need to plant seeds, inviting people to worship with us. Sometimes, the place where the seeds fall just isn't conducive for growth. Jesus tells the parable of the sower where some seed was eaten by the birds, some seed fell on rocky soil, and some seed grew but got choked out by weeds. Sometimes, it takes a while for the seeds to grow. One year, I planted carrots and nothing came up. The next spring when I went to till my garden, I had a row of carrots already growing.

There are things that we can do, but there are things over which we have no control. I can't make the seed open up and grab the soil and convert it into energy to grow. With churches, much depends on God's spirit preparing the soil of the heart of those we invite and opening up the seed and helping it grow. All we can do is pray that those we invite will be open to attending.

Once there are signs of life, we can nurture it by keeping the weeds of negativity and careless comments from choking the life out of it. And we can water it with encouragement, caring, support, and prayers.

Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. Our congregation's stewardship committee has selected the New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year. New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues. we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world. Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship. We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and Church Council members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship. Thanks in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday events.

Some statistics on reasons people give for becoming Christians and for joining the church.


