FROM THE PASTOR

For just two minutes, I invite you to put down the smart phone, the iPad/tablet, the mouse, the TV remote, the Wii/game controller, the grocery list. Listen for a second, because there are good things happening this Fall at First Church that you need to know

about, so come December you aren't left saying, "How did I miss out on that???"

Now, I'm not saying you have to do all these things and be at all these great activities. Use your head and your heart. Ask yourself, "What can I do, where can I put my energy in these coming months that will: a) feed my spirit and my brain cells, b) renew my sense of joy and purpose, c) strengthen my sense of belonging to a wonderful faith community, d) help me figure out how I can better give of myself and my gifts in the process, e) any or all of the above?"

No, I can't promise all of that will magically happen these coming weeks, but I can promise there are plenty of opportunities for each of these to become a reality in your life. As we say during Holy Communion, "Come, for all things are ready and all are welcome." Here are some highlights, in no particular order:

- Fourth, don't forget the other great standing opportunities provided by our LOGOS youth program, Adult Ministries, Children's Ministries and Youth Ministries; all of these and more are real gems in our midst.

LOGOS is a mid-week, inter-generational, relationship building program for children and youth in 1st through 12th grades. LOGOS meets on most Wednesdays from September 19 through April 17, 4:15-7:15 p.m. There are four parts to this weekly ministry: *Bible Study* - where children and youth are nurtured into intelligent, obedient and biblically-informed discipleship; *Worship Skills* - an essential and central part of the Christian community where young people learn about worship and prepare to lead in the Sunday morning service of worship; *Recreation* - where young people are allowed to experience great fun at the expense of no one else; and *Family Time* - where young people are assigned to a table along with adults who act as "table parents" and experience being a part of the family of God over a shared meal.

Matthew 19:14 - Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Our VBS 2012 goal was to share the Word of God with as many children as possible this summer. We touched the lives of 52 children (32 families) and 47 youth and/or adult volunteers this year, along with the involvement of 3 ministries of the church. We had an exciting and action-packed week! Many of you volunteered to be part of **Sky** and we thank you for your willingness to participate. We offered meals for our volunteers each evening.

All school age children participated in *Up & Away Sing & Play* where we met Pat, Orville, Scout, Apollo and Rockette as they helped us with our daily Bible Point, Story and Verse. They also participated in *Fly Away Finale* with *Spotlight VBS* each evening. The **Flight** Crews rotated between Wild Blue Bible Adventures, Sky High Movie & Missions, All-Star Games, Skydive Diner and Imagination Station. Our Preschool Treehouse children joined in *Up & Away Sing & Play* and had their own self-contained program in their own area of the building, with their very own *Fly Away Finale* each evening. On Thursday evening, families joined us for a family Mission Craft, Skydive Diner, the final Chadder's movie episode and our final *Fly Away Finale* with *Spotlight VBS*.

Up & Away Sing & Music CDs were available for learning the VBS songs. If you did not purchase your copy, you may still get one for \$6.00 so you can continue singing these wonderful songs throughout the year!

Operation Kid-to-Kid was our mission project again this year. Most children don't understand the value of money - it's not a tangible "need" for them. But they are familiar with being outside in the summer and the risk of being bitten by mosquitoes. Our children have been sprayed, slathered, and soaked with insect repellent by their parents to avoid these pesky bites. But imagine if avoiding mosquito bites was a matter of life and death! This year's mission project gave us the opportunity to bring in monetary donations of any amount that will be sent to World Vision to purchase mosquito nets for children in Mali, Africa. We placed our donations under our mosquito net display in the sanctuary and blessed them at our final Firefly Finale. VBS families got the opportunity to share God's boundless love for his children by creating Friendship Cards to send to the children who will receive mosquito nets. THANKS to our VBS participants and our congregation, we will be sending a check for \$1050 to purchase 175 mosquito nets!!!! Thank you to Outreach Ministry for purchasing the project supplies.

We were truly blessed to have a WONDERFUL spirit-filled week again this year! We were blessed by many monetary contributions, as well as time & talents. We could not have done it without the support and prayers of our church family. Thank you and God Bless you all!
