

PROPOSED CHANGES TO CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS

Church Council will propose three changes to the Church Constitution and By-Laws at the Pre-Annual Meeting. One of these changes affects all ministries:

BY-LAWS—ARTICLE ii. NOMINATIONS

Present form:

Terms of office for all members of ministries is two years. Normally, a member is eligible to serve two consecutive terms in the same ministry after which that member is ineligible to serve for one year in that ministry.

Replace with:

Ministry member will have two year terms that are renewable.

More information on all the proposed changes will appear closer to the Pre-Annual Meeting.
