FROM THE PASTOR

NEW BEGINNINGS

Part of the "back to school" ritual of many families with school age children is to review the clothes, notebooks, gym shoes, markers, etc. to see what will work for this year and what won't. This ritual of

readiness for the beginning of a new school year is part of millions of families' lives.

Every beginning begins with an ending. The ending of summer activities means possibilities for new beginnings. The first words of Genesis and the Gospel of John start, "*In the beginning...*" The Bible attaches great importance to beginnings, but they do not always come easy. Most beginnings that are positive are difficult. Did you know that most of the fuel for a space shuttle mission is used in the first few minutes as the shuttle breaks free of gravity? "Be strong," says our God, "I am with you always," whether it is the people of Israel journeying to the promised land, or a 4th grader beginning his first day of school, or any one of us as we begin each day, at home or at work.

Just like our "back to school" ritual, it is important to look at our lives to reflect how our beliefs and actions fit our commitment to Christ.

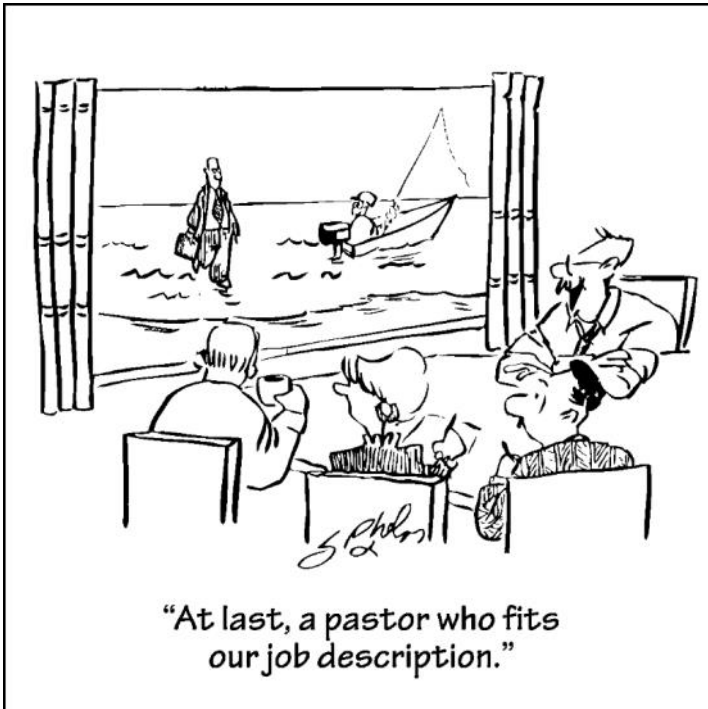

EVEREST Conquering Challenges with God's Mighty Power

Matthew 19:14 - Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Our VBS 2015 goal was to share the Word of God with as many children as possible again this summer. We touched the lives of 28 children (20 families) and 36 youth and/or adult volunteers this year, along with the involvement of three ministries of the church. We had an exciting and action-packed week! Many of you volunteered to be part of Everest and we thank you for your willingness to participate. We offered meals for our volunteers each evening.

Each evening, all school-age children participated in Base Camp Sing & Play (where we heard from Trek Rockrambler) and Summit Celebration with Spotlight VBS. The Crews rotated between Bible Expeditions, KidVid Cinema, Glacier Games, Mountaintop Treats, and Imagination Station. Our Preschool Peak children joined in Base Camp Sing & Play and had their own self-contained program in their own area of the building, with their very own Summit Celebration. Families were invited to join us in the sanctuary for Summit Celebration where we reviewed the day's activities, sang songs, and watched our Spotlight VBS video.

Music CDs were available for learning and enjoying the wonderful VBS songs all year long!

Through our Operation Kid-to-Kid mission project, we helped provide colorful, kid-friendly, Thai-language New Testaments for children in Thailand. During the week, participants brought in monetary donations of all sizes – it all made a difference. For just \$4.00, a child in India could have a colorful, kid-friendly, eye-catching, age-appropriate New Testament of his or her own, written in the Thai language! On Sunday at Imagination Station, kids personalized a unique Elephant Bank – then used it to collect coins or spare change to help purchase these New Testament.

We were truly blessed to have an AWESOME spirit-filled week again this year! We were blessed by many monetary contributions, as well as time and talents.
