

Following Jesus - The Light of the World

Matthew 19:14 - Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Our VBS 2016 goal was to share the Word of God with as many children as possible again this summer. We touched the lives of 30 children (20 families) and 31 youth and/or adult volunteers this year, along with the involvement of three ministries of the church. We had an exciting and action-packed week! Many of you volunteered to be part of **Cave Quest** and we thank you for your willingness to participate. We offered meals for our volunteers Monday - Thursday.

Each evening, all school-age children participated in *Sing & Play Rock* (where we heard from *Clark Cavern*) and *Cave Quest Closing* with *Spotlight VBS*. The Crews rotated between Deep Bible Quests, KidVid Cinema, Spelunker Sports & Games, Cavern Café, and Imagination Station. Our Tad's Preschool Pool children joined in *Sing & Play Rock* and had their own self-contained program in their own area of the building, with their very own *Cave Quest Closing*. Families were invited to join us in the sanctuary for *Cave Quest Closing* where we reviewed the day's activities, sang songs, and watched our Spotlight VBS video.

Music CDs were available for learning and enjoying the wonderful VBS songs all year long!

Through our *Operation Kid-to-Kid* mission project, we raised money to help hurting families in North America and shine hope into homes in need. During the week, participants brought in monetary donations of all sizes – it all made a difference. The donations will be sent to Group Cares, for the "tools" they need to resource teams of teenagers and other volunteers. On Sunday at Imagination Station, kids were given Change-a-Home Paper Banks to take home and decorate - then use them to collect coins or spare change for this mission project.

We were truly blessed to have an AWESOME spirit-filled week again this year! We were blessed by many monetary contributions, as well as time and talents. We could not have done it without the support and prayers of our church family. Thank you and God Bless you all!

LOGOS

We are getting ready for our sixteenth year of LOGOS this fall at First Congregational United Church of Christ. This is an exciting opportunity for children and youth, as well as the adults who serve. As you may know, LOGOS is a mid-week, inter-generational, relationship building program for children and youth in 1st through 12th grades. LOGOS meets most Wednesdays from mid-September through early-April from 4:15 p.m. - 6:45 p.m.

There are four parts to this weekly ministry: Bible Study - where they are nurtured into intelligent and biblically-informed discipleship; Worship Skills - where they learn preparation to lead the worship service; Recreation - where they are allowed to experience great fun at the expense of no one else; and Family Time - where they are assigned to a table along with adults who act as "table parents" and experience being a family of God over a home-cooked shared meal served family-style on real dishes with cloth tablecloths and napkins. There are registration fees, which help to defray costs of the meals and program supplies, with scholarships available upon request.

We already have a group of nine children and youth committed to participate this year and would love to share this ministry with others! If you have anyone in your circle of friends who might be interested in the program, please share this information with them and have them contact us as soon as possible.


