

September Scriptures

September Scriptures begin taking us to the end of the church's liturgical year. We will continue in Luke for the entire month. September 1st the theme is "Open Table" and then we move into A New Identity for Faith Formation Sunday, followed by Growing in God's Love on Just Peace Sunday, continuing with Prayerful Living and ending the month with Surprising Investment for American Indian Ministry Sunday. The scriptures keep urging us forward in our faith and we would all do well to follow the Spirit's urging!

September is also Stewardship Month at FCUCC. We begin our Stewardship program in earnest as we ask the question: What Shall I Bring? A children's musical from a few decades ago asks the same question, only they sing, "What Shall I Give?". And they answer their question, singing, "I give my heart; I give my hands; I give my head; I give my home." And another song in that same musical sings: "My hands belong to you, Lord, my hands belong to you! My heart belongs to you, Lord, my heart belongs to you!" Out of the mouths of babes comes truth and faith that can put the adults in the congregation listening, to shame. As I remember the song, when the young boy finished singing it, there wasn't a dry eye in the house! Sometimes it takes young faith to touch our old souls and remind us that we are all children in God's eyes. It's that same faith that we had as children when we were less hardened, less busy, less distracted. For a few weeks in September we are going to hear testimonies from people in our congregation who will share some of their faith with us. They will speak about Gifts of Love, Word and Deed, and Gifts of Presence.

As we move through Labor Day and Homecoming/Confirmation Reunion and Stewardship, may our hearts be touched by all we hear and experience and may our lives respond to what we experience. Let your life reflect God's goodness!

When our church was built in 1957, Paul and Wanta Breyfogle were members (Paul worked in Staley Management). When the indebtedness was completed on the original building, a committee was formed to add a needed new educational wing and Paul Breyfogle was the Chairman of that Building Committee spending almost daily time at the building site after work to make sure things were going correctly. When the new wing was completed in 1961, Paul was presented with a oil painting of the original church to remember the history.

Since both Paul and Neat have passed away as well as two of their four children (Nancy and John) who grew up in this church, Bill Breyfogle, who is probably age 58, asked if the Church would like to have the painting since it is such a big part of our history. 

Children and Youth Summer Outreach Project

Children's Youth and Outreach ministries are teaming up to help with disaster relief in this country and around the world. This summer, we will be collecting items for School Kits and Hygiene Kits as a part of Church World Service's disaster relief. We are also supporting the nurses at DMH with Hope Kits to send home with needy mothers with newborns and for babies who are going directly into foster care.

A list of specific items needed will be posted and published as well as a poster showing the progress towards our goal of 50 School Kits, 50 Hygiene Kits and 25 Newborn Hope Kits.

HYGIENE KITS

One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or microfiber)

One washcloth

One wide-tooth comb

One fingernail or toenail clipper

One bath-size bar of soap

One toothbrush in the package

Ten standard size Band-Aids

SCHOOL KITS

One pair of blunt scissors (rounded tip, only)

Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose leaf or filler paper)

One 30-centimeter /12" ruler

One hand-held pencil sharpener

One large eraser (no pencils with erasers)

Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers

One box of 24 crayons

NEWBORN HOPE KITS

One sleep and play outfit

Three onesie undershirts

Two burp cloths

One pack newborn diapers

One pack diaper wipers

Three pack Evenflo bottles

Bottle brush

Baby body wash and shampoo

A & D diaper rash TREATMENT cream

Safety 1st Baby Care Basics (brush, comb, clippers, nasal aspirator)



GROWING PROJECT UPDATE - August 15

We got a little over an inch of rain that has helped our corn crop to fill the kernels on the ears. The kernels are just starting to dent which means the kernels are firming up the material inside. They are getting doughy rather than milky. The rainfall will help the plants add dry matter to the kernels which will increase kernel size and weight and add to yield. Fungicide to help reduce the impact of foliar leaf diseases was applied by airplane.

Our church members and friends are bringing in their excess garden produce for sale by donation during Fellowship Hour. Growing Hope Globally says that \$55 will teach a person to feed himself for the rest of his life. At that rate, our garden sales have already helped 2 people to become food sustainable and they will never have to worry about being hungry again!
